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■ Abstract

This article discusses the theory of evolution, and explains its three parts. The first is the genetic mutation in all living organisms, the second is the survival of the best or natural selection, and the third is reproduction, which ensures the transmission of this new gene to subsequent generations. Then the article addresses three problems that played a major role in clarifying the theory. The article discusses also the most important narratives about impulsive creation in various religions.
